



## 2022 Nebraska School Counselor Association Scholarship Application

Scholarship competition for any high school senior in support of their post-secondary education.

### ELIGIBILITY

- ✓ Student must be a high school senior attending a public or private-secondary school in Nebraska.
- ✓ Student must attend an accredited post-secondary institution during the 2021-22 school year.
- ✓ Recommending Counselor must be a current NSEA (Nebraska School Counselor Association) member
- ✓ Earned a 2.5 or greater weighted GPA
- ✓ If selected, you will be asked to email a digital photo of yourself to the committee.

### DETAILS

- Awarded scholarship will be paid directly to the higher education institution.
- Three (3) scholarships will be awarded in the amount of \$500 each, one to each of the following school types: Class A, Class B, Class C/D (Based on high school's Track and Field classification)
- **Deadline: Entries must be postmarked no later than March 15, 2022**
- Scholarship awardees will be announced in April 2022

### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Compose an essay (500 words or less), that describes how your school counselor, or your school counselor program has assisted you to plan, decide, resolve, and/or grow in an area of your life. Topics may come from any related Pre-K-12 experience and are not limited to only the college or career planning process.
- Essays must be typed and double-spaced. **Do NOT put your name, your counselor's name, or the name of your high school in/on the essay. Failure to follow these guidelines will disqualify the applicant from consideration.**
